Eligible trees and zip codes

The SDG&E® Community Tree Rebate Program enables qualifying residential customers throughout the region to plant trees and other plant species to help provide direct environmental, health, and economic benefits. This program is designed for customers in parts of SDG&E's service territory where trees may be needed to help make a positive impact in their community.

Eligible Zip Codes

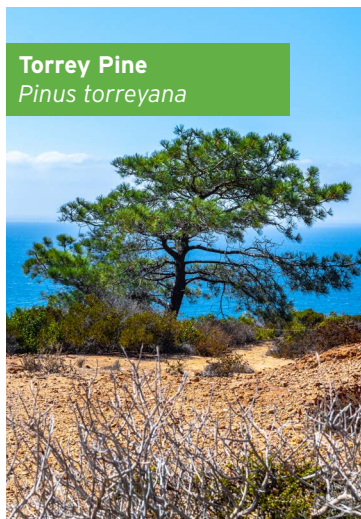

Native Trees

The trees in this section are specifically native to San Diego County. These trees are well adapted to the environmental conditions of our service territory. Native trees require less water than non-native species and support local biodiversity.

These trees are well suited for San Diego County and will make a great addition to most landscapes.

These trees have been selected under the Right Tree, Right Place Program as they are less likely to impact overhead powerlines and other infrastructure.

Guava	Pomegranate

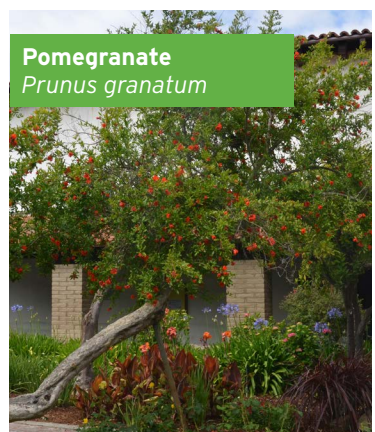
